

THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION

MARK 1:1-8

"Prepare the way of the Lord; make straight his paths."



I remember a comment I made about this Gospel passage when I was an adolescent. What's so great about a straight path? It's on the winding roads that you find the scenery. That memory returns to me as I reflect on this Gospel.

In quoting this passage from Isaiah, John the Baptist suggest an urgency about opening our hearts to God. Metaphorically the winding roads slow us down. Although I like winding roads, if I am in a hurry I take the straight road. Of course it is not speed we are advocating here, but rather steadfastness on the spiritual journey. The season of Advent is a time to evaluate, not our speed, but our stability in our quest for God. It is time to evaluate the obstacles in our lives

John was called to be a herald of the Lord's coming. He was to prepare hearts to recognize God's arrival in Christ. Each of us has a John-the-Baptistspirit in us. From our own wilderness places we proclaim with our lives that it is time to get ready.



Social Justice

Really! Who actually likes wearing face masks? They fog up your glasses and make your face itch. It's hard to talk intelligibly through them and nearly impossible to pick up nonverbal facial expressions that add vital texture to conversation. And they make it impossible to forget the depressing reality that COVID-19 is still around.

Plus the mask has become such a divisive political symbol, the masked and the masked-nots assuming the worst about each other. It's a sad commentary on our national state of mind that it's come to this: politicizing masks.

We are faced with an avalanche of evolving information and no shortage of inconsistency and hypocrisy from our government leaders. We default to siding with whatever partisan camp to which we belong. For most of us, independent, nuanced appraisal of a litany of complex issues is unrealistic for our already taxed brains.

For the members of Our Lady of Mercy Church, though, it's important to rise above the political partisanship and think through what our *faith* would call us to with regard to wearing or not wearing masks. What if our view on masks were shaped more by our Christian identity rather than our American political identity?

Christ calls us to care for the least of these among us — the sick, the elderly and the stranger included (Matt 25: 31-46.) We are challenged to sacrifice our own personal comfort, put on a mask and respect the lives of others. It is what all of us should do for the sake of our families, friends, neighbors, fellow parishioners, employees, customers and the community at large.

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments

Keeping God's Children Protected and Safe: The safe environment training of our children and youth is a key component in the Policy for the Protection of Children. Each year our schools and parishes are mandated to provide this training to all youth in catholic school and parish programs. Since 2003 over 200,000 children have received ageappropriate abuse prevention education. The Diocese maintains a working relationship with agencies in each of our 13 counties to provide training for our youth in schools and parishes. In addition, the Office for the Protection of Children and Youth maintains a media library containing videos for schools and parishes to provide child abuse prevention education. From 2016-19 over 31,000 parents have also received child abuse prevention education. Visit https://www.eriercd.org/ childprotection/ to see what the diocese is doing to help maintain safe environments for children and youth.

Our Neighbors' Place

Our Neighbors' Place is a beautiful ministry that addresses the people of the community who are homeless. The coordinators have been working very hard to come up with a plan that allows us to continue this ministry this unique year! We are very happy to say that there will be a season 9! The program will tentatively run from November 18, 2020 to March 17th or 24th, 2021. Space will be made available during our hosting times at the Mental Health building which is on the corner of 11th and Peach. We tentatively will be hosting 2 weeks in January and 2 weeks in March, with exact dates to be determined. There will be many changes made to this program due to COVID. These changes include:

- The number of cots will be limited. Cots will be 6 feet apart. We expect 25-30 beds.
- No-one with COVID, symptoms of COVID or those having a fever will be allowed to enter.
- Masks must be worn at all times; social distancing rules will apply.
- Guests must stay at their cots while in the shelter. Lights out will be at 10:00 p.m.
- There will be no food or beverages served for dinner or breakfast with the exception of Saturday dinner.
- We will need volunteers to prepare a Saturday meal; this must be a bagged or to-go dinner guests can eat at their cots.
- Bottled water will be made available.
- There will be a hired staff person from EUMA present at all times.
- We will need 2 people for each shift which are 7:00 -11:00 p.m., 11:00 p.m. 3:00 a.m., and 3:00 a.m. -
- Critical/hardest shifts to fill are the 11-3 and 3-7 shifts. If possible, we need one man and one woman for each shift.
- Regular cleaning will be a priority, volunteers will clean on the hour and a cleaning service will deep clean after guests leave each morning.
