



THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION



JOHN 1:6-8, 19-28

"He was not the light, but came to testify to the light."

The violet we use to decorate our churches during this season is the first color we see as the night sky changes from dark to light. This shade between dark and light reminds us that we wait in anticipation of the light - the birth of Jesus. John was not the light, but he came to say the light was coming. John knew his own role well - he was not the Christ, not Elijah, not the Prophet, but the one who cried out and called people to a baptism of repentance.

We received the light of Christ at our baptism, but perhaps we need John's baptism of repentance during this season. Maybe there is something in our life that is keeping us from fully preparing to receive Jesus this Christmas. Without a doubt, the world will speed up around us this season, but we are called to slow down, to look carefully at ourselves and to prepare a place in our heart for the Christ Child. The sky is changing from black to violet; the light is coming. Are we ready?

For Reflection: How could repentance help me to prepare for the light of Christ to shine through my life?



Social Justice

Really! Who actually likes wearing face masks? They fog up your glasses and make your face itch. It's hard to talk intelligibly through them and nearly impossible to pick up nonverbal facial expressions that add vital texture to conversation. And they make it impossible to forget the depressing reality that COVID-19 is still around.

Plus the mask has become such a divisive political symbol, the masked and the masked-nots assuming the worst about each other. It's a sad commentary on our national state of mind that it's come to this: politicizing masks.

We are faced with an avalanche of evolving information and no shortage of inconsistency and hypocrisy from our government leaders. We default to siding with whatever partisan camp to which we belong. For most of us, independent, nuanced appraisal of a litany of complex issues is unrealistic for our already taxed brains.

For the members of Our Lady of Mercy Church, though, it's important to rise above the political partisanship and think through what our faith would call us to with regard to wearing or not wearing masks. What if our view on masks were shaped more by our Christian identity rather than our American political identity?

Christ calls us to care for the least of these among us — the sick, the elderly and the stranger included (Matt 25: 31-46.) We are challenged to sacrifice our own personal comfort, put on a mask and respect the lives of others. It is what all of us should do for the sake of our families, friends, neighbors, fellow parishioners, employees, customers and the community at large.

What does this mean?

Our parish is a safe place for domestic violence victims to receive help.

Walk ins are welcome at the parish office and after-hours contacts are available upon request.

We have a team able to RECOGNIZE, RESPOND and REFER victims to Safe Journey/Safe Net. We are here to listen if someone needs to talk. Conversations are always confidential. This is a no judgement, safe place to get help and/or information.

The PurpleOne initiative includes: public awareness, training of community members, and being a safe place for domestic violence victims to find help.

Are you being abused?

This might be a complicated and difficult question to answer. Abuse is about power and control. An abusive partner uses various methods to establish and maintain control in the relationship. The methods of control are as broad as the abuser's imagination. Please see the checklist in the PurpleOne booklet to help identify techniques of control and abuse. This checklist and more information are available on the table under the bulletin board in the gathering space in a booklet entitled: "When Someone You Know is Being Hurt".
