



THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION



LUKE 1:26-38

"...and of his kingdom there will be no end."

The great symbol of Advent is the expectant mother, Mary, pregnant with her child Jesus. Each Advent is a time of waiting, not bored, dull waiting, but rather joyful, expectant, active waiting. And yet we are not waiting at all. For just as Jesus was already alive, already a person in Mary's womb, so Jesus is already with us as well.

How similar this is to the concept of "the kingdom" found in the Gospels. The kingdom has already begus, is already present, and will have no end. And we see evidence of this kingdom - in our experience of grace, in the goodness and generosity of others, in miracles small and large, in acts of love.

And yet it is also clear that Jesus' kingdom is not completely present. Whether in our own hearts or in the world we observe, the reign of Jesus is still yet to come in its fullness. The kingdom then is something that we are called day after day to make ever more present. With our Lord, let us pray daily, "thy kingdom come," and do what we can to quicken its coming.

For Reflection: What am I doing to help realize the kingdom of God in our midst?

boards in the Gathering Space.



Social Justice

Really! Who actually likes wearing face masks? They fog up your glasses and make your face itch. It's hard to talk intelligibly through them and nearly impossible to pick up nonverbal facial expressions that add vital texture to conversation. And they make it impossible to forget the depressing reality that COVID-19 is still around.

Plus the mask has become such a divisive political symbol, the masked and the masked-nots assuming the worst about each other. It's a sad commentary on our national state of mind that it's come to this: politicizing masks.

We are faced with an avalanche of evolving information and no shortage of inconsistency and hypocrisy from our government leaders. We default to siding with whatever partisan camp to which we belong. For most of us, independent, nuanced appraisal of a litany

of complex issues is unrealistic for our already taxed brains.

For the members of Our Lady of Mercy Church, though, it's important to rise above the political partisanship and think through what our *faith* would call us to with regard to wearing or not wearing masks. What if our view on masks were shaped more by our Christian identity rather than our American political identity?

Christ calls us to care for the least of these among us—the sick, the elderly and the stranger included (Matt 25: 31-46.) We are challenged to sacrifice our own personal comfort, put on a mask and respect the lives of others. It is what all of us should do for the sake of our families, friends, neighbors, fellow parishioners, employees, customers and the community at large.

Staff member's reflection on the last 9 months of Covid ministry. By Donna Clark

Navigating the ups and downs on the journey of ministering through this Covid experience has led to a vast array of emotions but also insights about myself, my passions and my limitations. Personally I think I have encountered far more limitations and frailties than I expected. Like many I thought that the life changes we encountered in March would be short lived — especially since we started to open up again in June; we started public Masses and slowly, different small groups and ministries began to meet in person. But the three months of reworking the way I minister turned into five and seven and now nine. Needless to say I am experiencing the Covid fatigue like so many others.

I learned that what I would like to do in ministering to the parish and what is actually possible with limited energy are not the same. How easy I thought it would be to stay in touch with all our homebound or some of our elderly and vulnerable parishioners have not returned to Mass . . . but it wasn't. The outreach ministries I coordinate are all about encounter with the other; home, hospital and nursing home visits, support groups, spiritual direction, ladies' lunch etc. I would keep an eye out for people coming into church so I could chat with them, find out how they were doing but slowly the number of people coming to Mass started to fall again and those coming into the church for group meetings has dwindled to near zero. I am saddened to think of cancelling the grief support group or the

widows' gatherings and replacing them with online meetings because not everyone can do the online. I drew such joy and energy from visiting parishioners in their homes, brining communion and news of the parish. My weekly visits to the hospitals and nursing homes have come to a grinding halt. It is rare that I am allowed to visit and when I do it takes even more energy than it used to.

Slowly all the actions and encounters that defined much of my ministry has been taken away. I am filled with disappointment. As a staff we experienced a giant learning curve with our livestream Mass and events, and online meetings. I am tired. I see everything I am not doing. I am discouraged. Some days there was an intense desire just to run away . . .

Then a line from a stewardship newsletter gave me a new perspective. "If you can't feed a hundred people, then feed just one." (Saint Teresa of Calcutta) and "Do not wait . . . do it alone, person to person." I observed that most days I did talk to at least one person. I could not have group meetings but I could organize zoom meetings or I could do one on one in an open space. I could not visit everyone in the nursing home but was allowed to see a few people in special circumstances. I also began to hear stories of how parishioners were helping each other. The Pastoral Council is also helping with a second round of phone calls to parishioners. People would check on those they would have chatted with at Mass. All is not lost. I know the future of the ministry at Our Lady of Mercy will look different; how I connect with people will not return completely to the in person gatherings. Have I and will I allow the Holy Spirit to inspire me in my care for the community? I have hope.
