



THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION

MARK 1:21-28

The people were spellbound...because he taught with authority and not like the scribes.



In my college freshman year, I studied under an extraordinary history professor. From the moment he walked in, the classroom became a stage where the history of Western Civilization was enacted. Dr. Robert Reid engaged our imagination with scenes from the past, making what happened in Athens 2,000 years ago come to life without using a single note! Until then, history was a series of dry events that happened long ago: dates, names, treaties, battles contained in the pages of lifeless textbooks to be memorized for a test and then quickly forgotten. But my view of life was changed during that semester. He taught like no one I had ever heard before. He taught with authority.

The people who listened to Jesus at the beginning of his ministry must have had a similar experience. Unlike the religious teachers with whom they were familiar - the scribes and the rabbis - Jesus spoke with authority. He did not quote the "experts"; he was the expert! Try to imagine how their hearts must have pounded as they listened to Jesus' words for the first time!

For Reflection: Today Jesus speaks to me with the same authority. Am I prepared to be amazed as I listen to his words?

Help for Heating - LIHEAP


The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) was open to help alleviate heating bill stress on low income families. A family of

Ever-constant God, You remain eternal and unchanged while the earth spins us each day toward a new sunrise and a new reality.


Help us as we search for a minister of music and liturgy.




LECTIO: MARY: EPISODE 1 THE NEW EVE
