



THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION

MARK 1:40-45

A Leper came to Jesus...moved with pity, [Jesus] stretched out his hand.



In Jesus' day "leprosy" could mean any number of skin disorders, from rashes to what we today call Hansen's disease. Whatever form the malady took, it was considered serious enough to require the sufferer to remove himself from the community until a healing took place. Lepers were like the living dead, separated by law from their friends and loved ones, always keeping to the outskirts of villages, helpless, unwanted, untouchable, feared.

The leper in today's reading crashes through the conventions associated with his illness: he comes to Jesus, kneels before him, and asks to be healed. He's had enough; he comes directly to the Lord and tells him what he needs...and receives it.

Jesus meets the man right where he is because he sees him as a human, not merely as a walking mass of sores. Jesus goes beyond the law and touches the man, healing him.

Restored to life and his people, the man tells everyone what Jesus has done for him. Jesus sees us in our leprous condition of sin, fear, and sadness. When we've had enough, he's ready to reach for us.

For Reflection: What might be preventing me from coming to Jesus and asking to be healed?

The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 17, 2021 and concludes when the Paschal Triduum of the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of the Lord begins at the start of the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday evening, April 1, 2021.

The following regulations are promulgated and binding for all Catholics in the Diocese of Erie for Lent and the Paschal Triduum.

- 1. Traditional Lenten practices of PRAYER, FASTING, and ALSMGIVING and other forms of self-denial are recommended most warmly by the Church. Daily Mass is particularly encouraged.
- 2. ASH WEDNESDAY, ALL FRIDAYS IN LENT, and GOOD FRIDAY are days of abstinence from meat for those 14 years of age and older.
- 3. ASH WEDNESDAY AND GOOD FRIDAY are also days of fasting for those ages 18 to 58 inclusive. On these days, those bound by the law of fasting may take one full meal. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength according to one's needs, are also permitted. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or work is seriously affected, the law does not oblige.

We keep Lent together as one parish family.

We put aside our business-as-usual to support each other in prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

We turn to God to enlighten us and purify us throughout the lengthening brightness of this holy season.
