



THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION

JOHN 3:14-21

"God so loved the world that

he gave his only Son."

Nicodemus is by all accounts a religious man, a searcher for truth. Still, in this earnest (probably whispered) conversation in the middle of the night, how difficult it seems for him to "hear" the Good News: By "lifting up" his own son, God will bring to life what is dead through sin.

What does Nicodemus look for? Clear answers...some personal assurances...a safe, private friendship with Jesus? Does he understand the invitation of that meeting with Jesus? Will he delight at "getting" the Good News? We don't know for sure if he does, after all, become Jesus' follower.

Am I not like poor Nicodemus, wanting clear answers and simple solutions to life's problems, rather than a shake-up in my own life? Faced with this kind of God, who loves us so much to suffer terribly for our freedom to be his children, I may also find myself with little to say.

Is such a God "altogether too much," too good to believe? Have we heard this Good News, really? Jesus' story of a God so "crazy for us" would change the way we do things too much, for we have gotten too used to living our settled lives.

For Reflection: How might I hear God's offer of love to me these days of Lent?

Because the texts of what became the New Testament are maddeningly inconsistent regarding such questions, it took Christians centuries to hammer out answers - with lots of dissentions. excommunications, and schisms along the way - that a majority could grudgingly accept. Understanding how church teachings about Jesus took shape over time allows us to reflect on the deep questions raised by the incarnation - questions we might too easily skip over if we just assume current doctrine is "how it always was." Strengthen us to live for a time within the haze of uncertainty assured that you are present with us and already acting to provide for our needs.



We hear so little about St Joseph in the bible.


