



THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION

JOHN 20:1-9

She ran and went to Simon Peter . . .



I am often struck by the excited, spontaneous responses evoked by Jesus in those who encountered him. Hearing his call, fishermen abandoned family and trade; touched by his healing hand - and despite his plea to the contrary - the healed went forth to speak his praises; liberated from the weight of sin by his unbounded mercy, the forgiven leapt in joyful freedom.

Reflecting on such spontaneity, I ask myself: am I as quick to follow Jesus, to proclaim him, to persevere in freedom? After all, I am every bit as much called, healed, and forgiven as they.

John reports that Jesus' Resurrection evoked just such excitement in Mary Magdalene, Peter, and the beloved disciple. Mary "ran" to tell Peter, who with the other disciple "ran" to see for themselves. Seeing, breathless, they believed.

The implications of his rising were enormous: not simply a rabbi, a healer, a reconciler, Jesus was God's Son, who destroyed the grasp of death. The Risen One had opened the door to eternal life.

For Reflection: Am I slow to understand the Scripture that Jesus had to rise from the dead, or will I run in excited faith, proclaiming his Resurrection by a changed life?


Year of St Joseph Raffle

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments

Child Abuse Prevention Month Reporting known or suspected child abuse is everyone's responsibility: It is every adult's moral responsibility to report known or suspected abuse or neglect of a minor to the responsible authorities. Sexual abuse of minors is a pervasive societal problem, and only concerted and sustained efforts by all adults in every segment of society can help to protect children and youth. In the current Pennsylvania state report there were 5,202 substantiated reports of child abuse in Pennsylvania during 2019. 2,087 or 40% of the substantiated reports were for sexual abuse, 1, 448 were physical abuse. To report suspected abuse of a minor, call Childline at 1-800-932-0323 (anytime 24/7). 


