THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION JOHN 10:11-18 GOOD SHEPHERD LAYS DOWN HIS



JOHN 1U:11-18 "A good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep."

Scripture gives us many images of God and perhaps none so dear as that of the Good Shepherd. Just as Jesus is the Good Shepherd, we, too, can find in our lives these shepherd-like qualities.
