

THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION



JOHN 15:1-8

"WHOEVER REMAINS IN ME AND I IN HIM WILL BEAR MUCH FRUIT."



John frequently writes of what theologians call the "mutual indwelling" - Christ in the Christian and the Christian in Christ. This Gospel reading is one of the most vivid of these analogies. While the vine and the branches are distinct from one another, they are of the same seamless substance. Our "indwelling" with Christ occurs through our sharing in his life, flowing through his word and the sacraments.

Although God wills it for us, we must take deliberate steps to bring about this shared life. We engage Jesus in prayerful conversation and in listening. We are strengthened, forgiven, and nourished in his sacramental offering of grace. We make difficult choices, denying ourselves at times, to build up the Body of Christ. We accept the pruning by his word which cuts away that part of us which does not bear good fruit.

Taking these deliberate steps with a firm faith in God, assured of his boundless love and forgiveness, and opening ourselves to his Spirit dwelling within us, we in turn dwell in Christ Jesus. Then through him, with him, and in him, and never apart from him, we will bear good fruit: loving one another and keeping God's commandments.

For Reflection: In what ways am I taking steps to embrace my life in Christ and Christ's life in me?

Adjust privacy settings for online games, apps, social media sites and your child's electronic devices. Don't forget to check the GPS settings ability to unintentionally share your child's location. Avoid using public wi-fi when sharing personal information. Visit https://www.eriercd.org/childprotection/ to see what the diocese is doing to help maintain safe environments for children and youth.
