

Pentecost Sunday - May 23, 2021

Next weekend, we celebrate Pentecost Sunday, please remember to wear red. Pentecost marks the end and the goal of the Easter season. For Christians, it is a memorial of the day the Holy Spirit



descended on the apostles and the Virgin Mary in the form of fiery tongues, an event that took place fifty days after the Resurrection of Jesus. The Paschal Mystery --the Passion, the Death, the Resurrection, and the Ascension of Jesus -- culminates in the sending of the Holy Spirit by the Father (at the request of His Son), on Jesus' disciples. The feast also commemorates the official inauguration of the Christian Church by the apostolic preaching of St. Peter, which resulted in the conversion of 3000 Jews to the Christian faith.


