

## THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION

JOHN 6:41-51

"Is this not Jesus, the son of Joseph?"



Those who knew Jesus as that villager who lived just down the lane were hard pressed to count his words as the teaching of God. What could he say that hasn't been said before? But, then, he tells them he is the bread that comes down from heaven. What kind of talk is that coming from a child of that Joseph and Mary?

It was entirely possible to be too familiar with Jesus. Those who knew Jesus from childhood knew too much about him to have any need for what he said, let alone to drop their livelihoods and follow him. They were not hungry enough to recognize the aroma of fresh baked bread.

Today Christians who have frequently pondered the message of chapter 6 of John argue whether Jesus was referring to the Eucharist or his teaching when speaking of himself as bread. And the answer, of course, is that we are wrong. If we are hungry enough for the bread of which he spoke, we would recognize it whenever, wherever it was offered. Our mouths would be full of bread, who would have time to argue?

For Reflection: How hungry am I for what Jesus offers me in word and sacrament?


