



THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION

MARK 10:17-30

Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said..."Go, sell...give...come, follow me."



Many say this story of the rich young man is the saddest story in the Gospel, and I would agree. He runs to Jesus with so much enthusiasm and falls to his knees at Jesus' feet. Raising his eyes to Jesus he asks, "Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" It's evident that he's heard about Jesus and about this new kingdom of God. Today he has his chance and finds Jesus at last. His inheritance has given him status in life, but he wants to be part of this kingdom of which Jesus speaks.

But Jesus has a challenge for the man. Enternal life is a gift of God and obeying the commandments is only the beginning of accepting that gift. Jesus, looking at him with love, asks him to leave all and "follow me." Not the response the man expected. The face so full of joy now falls, and he turns and walks away from Jesus. Being part of God's kingdom means putting God first and the man seems torn because he treasures his status and wealth.

This story deserves to be heard with new ears each time we hear it. It's not just about the rich man, it's about us. Again, and again, Jesus is looking with love at me and asking, "Am I first in your life?"




