



THIS SUNDAY'S
REFLECTION
JOHN 18:33b-37



While we Americans can appreciate the tradition and the panoply associated with kings and queens, we would never prefer monarchial government to our own democratic form. After all, we know what it's like from our colonial days and we fought a war to be free from kingly rule.

So today's solemnity of Christ the King may seem a little quaint to Americans, a little out of step with our 230-year experiment in democracy. Perhaps, but we honor today a ruler whose kingdom is not of this world. Jesus redefined kingship.

Pilate thought he knew all about kings; he was a "friend of Caesar" - a political title bestowed on loyal middle managers such as himself. But he didn't know about Jesus's kind of kingdom.

Pilate understood power and control, the strength of horses and soldiers. But he didn't get the notion of service and the washing of feet. Nor would he understand how Jesus put up no resistance at his arrest, telling his followers to sheathe their swords. Those who buy into the allurement of power and control over others will not understand a kingdom based on truth, mercy, and justice for the rights of everyone, nor will they understand its King.

For Reflection: What does it mean to me to celebrate the kingship of Christ? Do I recognize the kind of kingdom he embodies?
