CSA - 2021 Report

Thank you for your generous support of the 2021 Catholic Services Appeal. As of May 1, 2021, we have received 157 pledges in the amount of **\$77,555**.

This will allow us to meet our parish assessment of **\$68,405** and allow our parish to meet our needed extraordinary costs such as repairing pot holes in the parking lot (\$6,000-\$7,000) and repairing the steel structure of our large, corner cross (\$3,800). We also plan to start saving for future capital improvements.

If you have not yet made a pledge, it is not too late to do so. Forms may be found in the parish office. There is no gift too small.

"Ordinary people helping each other connect everyday life and faith, regularly."





KNIGHTS ULTRASOUND INITIATIVE

On April 14th, Father Ritchie blessed the new state of the art ultrasound machine at the Women's Care Center of Erie County. This purchase was made possible through fundraising initiated by the Our Lady of Mercy Knights of Columbus. This machine will save the lives of many unborn children, as approximately 80% of abortion bound women chose life after viewing their sonogram images.

In 2020, 87 lives were saved as a result of the Women's Care Center's remarkable efforts. Our Knights have pledged to continue their support of this most worthy Christian agency.



BUILDING AND GROUNDS COMMITTEE



Like many other organizations Covid has put a crimp on our activities. However the Committee was able to complete a number of outside projects over the past year:

- The Ash Borer has decimated about 40 large Ash trees on the Church property. We cut the trees down, cut them up, disposed of the limbs, had the stumps ground, filled in with topsoil and planted grass. It was a huge effort and thanks to the Committee we were able to do all of the work except the stump grinding ourselves to keep the costs down.
- Early last fall the committee repainted the parking lot lines. Most of them are fairly straight.
- The exposed structural beams at the Dutton Road entrance were wire brushed and repainted. The Bartlett Road beams will be done this summer.
- The Food Pantry was fitted with new doors as a final step in the complete renovation. All that needs to be done to finish the project is some trim work. Thanks to John Madigan and his crew for completing this significant project.

Work planned for this spring and summer includes:

- April work party to mulch the exterior of the church, plant flowers in the Rose Garden and do general clean up and repair outside. Wash Sperry Hall, classroom and inside Gathering Space windows.
- Repair the pot holes at the parking lot aprons. (\$6,000-\$7,000)
- If you look about 50 feet up at the cross at the corner of the church you can see where the exposed steel beams are rusted. We are looking for a painting company with a high lift to clean and repaint the beams before rust damages the mortar joints. (\$3,800)

Helping the Homeless 🖤



On May 29, EUMA and Highmark will sponsor a 5K walk to raise money for services to provide for those who are homeless in Erie County. There are three ways that you can join this effort. You can join the walk at 10:00 on May 29 at the Refuge and ending at Liberty House. You can walk 5K anytime, anywhere in the month of May and send the money you raise to EUMA. You can support a walker, including the members of the OLM Social Justice Committee by bringing a donation to Irene at the church before May 29.

How do we define "homeless"? We often think of the single man, dealing with mental health issues or addiction problems, living on the streets, and occasionally taking advantage of soup kitchens and shelters. However, there is much more to homelessness and many more people are affected. According to HUD, anyone who "lacks a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence" is homeless. Additionally, anyone who will lose their housing in 14 days is homeless. Children and families are considered homeless when they have not had a lease for housing for 60 days. Finally, anyone fleeing a dangerous situation without a place to stay is considered homeless. An example you can easily imagine is a family staying with relatives because they cannot afford a place of their own. They are considered homeless. How much of a problem is this in Erie County? Every year, a "Point in Time" count of the homeless is taken throughout the country. The most recent count in Erie was in January of 2020. It found only 8 people who were sleeping on the streets, but there were 996 individuals who would qualify as homeless using the criteria listed above.

Due to the pandemic, the count was not able to be accomplished this year. However, we know that maintaining employment has been difficult during this crisis. Other contributors to homelessness, such as mental health issues and/or addiction problems, have all been exacerbated by the pandemic. A count this year may have found even more people in need.

The good news is that there are many programs helping the homeless in Erie County. Some of them are government programs with funding from federal, state, county or city resources. Others are private non-profits – many of them faith-based. All of them are working to meet the needs of the homeless and find a way to help them maintain housing. You can help! Our parish usually volunteers at the winter emergency shelter and will probably do so again after the pandemic. Watch the bulletin for how to volunteer. And, of course you can donate money through the walkathon or on your own.

As St. John Chrysostom said, "Not to share one's wealth with the poor is to steal from them and to take away their livelihood. It is not our own goods which we hold, but theirs."
