

THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION

MATTHEW 2:1-12

Magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews?"



Just who were these Magi? Exactly where did they come from? They came from the east and yet they represent westerners and northerners and southerners as well. Indeed, they were the first of all of us who cannot count Abraham among our physical ancestors to have faith in the infant king of the Jews. They came from people whose prophets, if any, are unnamed in our Scripture. They came because his light led them to his home. They came because they wanted to do him homage.

Most of us have family or friends who seem to have abandoned the Christian faith and gone east or elsewhere in search of meaning. It is a great sadness. These mysterious visitors from the east give me hope, however. They didn't come because a parent nagged them. No shame-laced finger wagged them onto their camels. From their own religious resources, out of their own spiritualties, they recognized a light that led them to Christ. And God made sure they found the truth and kept both the Christ Child and these seekers safe, even when evil plotted to intervene.

The light of Christ summons seekers. It shines as brightly today as then.




