THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION

JOHN 2:1-11

"Do whatever he tells you."



This is a phrase we have heard and will continue to hear from birth to death. From the time we were of age to talk, we were told, "do whatever he/she tells you." It continued when we were left with a babysitter, then at church, then at school, then in sports, then at our jobs, then when we were married. Throughout all stages in life, over and over again, these dynamic words resound in our minds and hearts.

The important time, however, is the time in our lives when we accept Jesus Christ as our Savior - then do the words mean more and more to us. The New Testament writers in all kinds of ways instruct us to "do whatever he tells us." When we follow their urging, we rejoice in the miracle of transformation in our lives knowing that God is at hand.

So, as we listen to his teachings and we read the Scriptures, and as we learn the lessons of life, in the background we hear echoes of Mary's words to the wine stewards. When we "do whatever he tells us," if we listen closely, we may hear God applaud.

For Reflection: Am I listening so I can "do what God tells me"?

Did you know...

Our Lady of Mercy subscribes to ONELICENSE, a service that allows music directors to print music for church congregations pulled from many music publishers. This affords



congregations the opportunity to sing older hymns and newer hymns that are not found in their hardbound hymnals. During Advent and Christmas our worship aids enabled Our Lady of Mercy's music director to choose treasured pieces of music from such sources and share them with all of you. In addition, many of the responsorial psalms we sing during our masses are using music settings not found in our hymnal. Some of the reasons for not using our hymnal settings are difficulty and vocal range (too high).

As we embark on the season of Ordinary Time I will be going back to the use of our hardbound hymnals and listing the hymn numbers on our numbers board. The psalm number will not be listed if it is not in our hvmnal.

In addition, because we no longer have a Processional during the Preparation of the Gifts a congregation song is typically not listed in our worship aid. Only a short instrumental background piece or short choir song while the gifts are prepared is utilized.
