






THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION

LUKE 1:1-4; 4:14-21

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor.



Today's Gospel will be proclaimed from the pulpit by a priest or a deacon. But it begs for more. It begs to be enacted with great drama. Why? Two reasons.

First, because Isaiah's words, and Jesus' dramatice reading of them, so powerfully describe and preview his ministry. This is crucial to our understanding of Christianity.

Second, the words Jesus read in 30 A.D. now describe our ministry. In baptism, all of us were given the responsibility for bringing glad tidings to the poor, liberating captives, and freeing the oppressed. How well are we doing that?

One way to measure that is to search our thoughts and attitudes for "isms." The late Father Joseph Biltz of Little Rock taught me about "isms" and how to recognize them. An "ism" results when we believe certain negative things about a whole group of people. We treat them as "less than," withholding from them the respect they deserve as children of God. "Isms" may be defined as a combination of power, prejudice and discrimination. Racism, ageism, sexism, elitism - these "isms" keep whole groups of people poor, captive and oppressed. Our baptism requires us to recognize and fight against all of them.

For Reflection: When have I been able to recognize and reject false portrayals of certain groups of people?





Dear Friends & Supporters, The Baby Box Committee really appreciated your wonderful support this past year. In spite fo all the turmoil Haiti has experienced in recent months, our program has been able to continue. With your help, we were able to ship 390 Baby Boxes to Haiti to enable babies there to have a safe place to sleep. It also enabled us to hire a nurse in Haiti to provide Child Care Classes for the moms prior to the birth of their infants. Many now often get their child care advice from the local witch doctor. After the moms complete these classes, they are provided with a Baby Box complete with bedding, clothing and other items she will need for her newborn. These Baby Boxes provide many smiles on the faces of the moms who receive them. We are excited to learn that the new Birthing Center located at the Dorothy Frederickson Health and Education Community Center will soon be completed. This will provide moms with a safe place to deliver their infants. They plan for the completion of this facility is the end of this year. Thanks to all of you who are helping us save the lives of some babies and moms in Haiti where the infant and maternal mortality rate is among the highest in the world.
