

THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION

LUKE 6:17, 20-26

"Blessed are you who are poor, for the kingdom of God is yours...But woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation."



The Gospels of Luke and Matthew both contain beatitudes, a list of blessings. Only Luke adds the "woes." In Matthew, Jesus says, "Blessed are they . . ." In Luke, it is "you." The woes and the use of "you" emphasizes that Jesus is talking to us; and it's serous.

So are we rich or are we poor?

All the things we might say we "have" - cars, houses, jobs, money, health, even friends or family all of these are not really "ours." We could just as easily not have them.

To be in God's kingdom, it would seem that you must recognize your poverty. When you are truly poor, you know you are in need. You understand that just to eat, to exist, you are relying on someone else. You need help from someone, not some thing.

The Greek word used in Luke for the "consolation" experienced by the rich includes the idea of an aid or help that one leans on in order to stand. The rich think they have their consolation. Luke challenges us to lean only on the Son of Man and share what is "ours" with others.

For Reflection: Am I rich or am I poor? On whom do I lean?



SYNOD KEY TERM

What is a synod?

"Synod" comes from ancient Greek. It can be translated as "journeying together." Its literal meaning reminds us of Jesus as the Way, the Truth and the Life (John 14:6) and of Christians as followers of the Way (Acts 9:2). In Christianity it became the proper term for an assembly specifically called to discern, in accordance with the Holy Spirit, answers to important questions for the Church. One of the earliest examples is the Council of Jerusalem, described in Acts 15. Synods have been used at all levels of the Church, from local diocesan synods all the way up to the Synod of Bishops for the universal Church. They generally deal with how we can best live out our faith in practice.

A synod can be thought of as a type of family meeting. By this analogy, the bishops are like the head of a household, with responsibility for the Church and authority to make decisions for her. In order to make the best possible decisions, they check in with the rest of the family and ask for our experiences and input. Then, taking everything into consideration, they make the decision. Bishop Persico, for example, is using this method for Pastoral Planning in our diocese. A synod is not democratic, and it is not majority rule. It is a means of discussing and discerning God's will, the God who is drawn always to the poor and little ones.

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments

Digital Dating Abuse can be defined as "a pattern of behaviors that control, pressure, or threaten a dating partner using a cell phone or the internet." One quarter of youth (12-17) who have been in a romantic relationship during the previous year report that they'd been the victim of digital dating abuse. So, what are some of the best ways for a parent to open up communication with their child about a delicate topic like online dating? First and foremost, ask your child what they are doing online and then really *listen* to why they like or don't like what's going on there. Parents must be diligent about staying on top of the latest trends. Great online dating tips can be found at www.cyberwise.org. 
