

This Sunday's REFLECTION

LUKE 10:1-12, 17-20

He sent [the seventy-two others] ahead of him.



As I read and reflected on this Scripture passage, I began to wonder - where did Jesus live? Jesus left his home and family and moved from town to town proclaiming "the kingdom of God is at hand." From Mark's Gospel we learn that Capernaum became his home (probably with Peter's family) but not much is said about how he lived while journeying from place to place. So when he sent disciples ahead of him, his instructions must have come form personal experience. He traveled light, accepted hospitality from strangers, stayed in town for a period of time proclaiming the kingdom, and then moved on to another. Occasionally, he returned home to Capernaum.

Now it doesn't say that every disciple became a lifelong preacher for the kingdom. Some may have become part of Jesus' team for a short time, others may have made longer commitments. They were chosen and learned to walk with Jesus wherever they lived.

We are all called to be disciples but not all of us are called to leave our families. We teach, preach, and heal in the name of Jesus in our daily lives. As those early disciples, we learn how to be disciples by being with Jesus.

For Reflection: Can I imagine Jesus living in my everyday patterns? Where would he invite me to find ways to follow and serve?
