

THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION

LUKE 17:11-19

"...he fell at the feet of Jesus and thanked him."



Are we the one, or one of the nine? When Jesus entered the village, ten lepers met him, called out and asked for pity. Surely all ten held out some level of hope that Jesus could help them, otherwise why would they call out after him? We cannot know what they really knew about Jesus and his ministry, but they call him "Jesus, Master."

Perhaps the lepers had already heard about his power to heal and hoped that healing would be theirs as well. Jesus commands them to show themselves to the priests and they are healed, but only one comes back, bows down, and thanks Jesus.

We all come to Jesus to ask for pity, for healing of one kind or another. We call Jesus by name. We have heard about his power to heal, and believe he will help us; otherwise why would we call out to him? When we ask, we are healed. But in our humanity we still sin; we are still broken and return time and time again to ask for his healing compassion. Each time we ask, we receive, but how many of us return to bow down and thank the Lord for his mercy?





Eucharistic Revival at Our Lady of Mercy

What Does The Eucharist Mean To Me?

What Does The Eucharist Mean to You? Many Catholics were shocked when a national survey revealed that most Catholics have a limited understanding of the Eucharist and a tenuous connection to this central Mystery of our faith. As the Bishops of the U.S. launch a two year Eucharistic Revival, OLM is taking a moment to reflect on what the Eucharist means to each of us. The most significant way to influence others is by sincerely sharing from the heart. Therefore, each of us is invited to make a short 2 to 3 minute video witnessing to what the Eucharist means to each one of us personally. These videos will be posted on the parish Facebook and webpage in October and November. If anyone needs help making the recording, just visit the parish office and Katie will record you on her phone. Willing to write but not willing to speak on camera? Submit your reflection in writing and a volunteer will record it for you. Feel free to find a format that feels comfortable to you. Interview your child or grandparent about the meaning of the Eucharist in their life, share a meaningful quote, describe a moment when your connection to the Eucharist got you through a painful time or when the Eucharist finally made some sense to you, tell us what you wish your grandchild or other Catholics could feel about the Eucharist. Your approach is as personal as your connection to the Eucharist. There are sign-up lists and instructions in the Gathering Space. Remember to record your reflection in landscape mode.







This is an opportunity for us to come together as a community and pray in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.



The Day of the Dead (el Día de los Muertos), is a Mexican holiday around the Feast of All Saints and All Souls, where families welcome back the souls of their foods and join in the celebrations! their deceased relatives for a brief reunion that includes food, drink and celebration.

In the YuCatan, where our sister parish is located, this celebration has a Mayan influence and is called Hanal Pixan. It is similar to the Dia de los Muertos and is a two day holiday that reunites the living and dead. Families create 'ofrendas '(Offerings) to honor their departed family members. These altars are decorated with bright yellow marigold flowers, photos of the departed, and the favorite foods and drinks of the one being honored.

The offerings are believed to encourage visits from the land of the dead as the departed souls hear their prayers, smell Families also gather for special dinners.

Our Sister Parish Committee would like to have an 'ofrenda' here at Our Lady of Mercy in the gathering space. If you would like to honor a loved one's memory, please bring a labeled picture and perhaps a memento and place it on the altar in the Gathering Space the weekend of Oct. 22/23. Our space is limited, so please do not bring in anything that is large. The altar will remain up through the first weekend of November. Families are asked to claim their pictures and mementos the weekend of November 5/6.


