



THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION



LUKE 18:1-8

"...pray always without becoming weary."

Prayer, it seems to me, is an acknowledgement of our relationship with God, and more importantly, an acknowledgement of our dependency on God. Prayer keeps us open to the presence of God in our lives. We make time for God and spend time with God when we have come to value and appreciate God's love for us.

Prayer is what we do when we fully enter into the words and actions of the Mass. It is what we do when we let the word of Scripture address our lives. It is what we do when we speak to God about the joys and sorrows, hurts and disappointments, successes and failures we have experienced.

Each year I participate in a directed retreat where I spend time (in silence) with others who make prayer the center of their lives. It is such a support to be with people who spend their days, like you, in communication with God.

Prayer for me is like that one difficult piece of a jigsaw puzzle that pulls together the other sections. Through our daily conversations with God, we uncover meaning in the mysteries of life.

Grief Support Monthly Group





Eucharistic Revival at Our Lady of Mercy

What Does The Eucharist Mean To Me?

What Does The Eucharist Mean to You? Many Catholics were shocked when a national survey revealed that most Catholics have a limited understanding of the Eucharist and a tenuous connection to this central Mystery of our faith. As the Bishops of the U.S. launch a two year Eucharistic Revival, OLM is taking a moment to reflect on what the Eucharist means to each of us. The most significant way to influence others is by sincerely sharing from the heart. Therefore, each of us is invited to make a short 2 to 3 minute video witnessing to what the Eucharist means to each one of us personally. These videos will be posted on the parish Facebook and webpage in October and November. If anyone needs help making the recording, just visit the parish office and Katie will record you on her phone. Willing to write but not willing to speak on camera? Submit your reflection in writing and a volunteer will record it for you. Feel free to find a format that feels comfortable to you. Interview your child or grandparent about the meaning of the Eucharist in their life, share a meaningful quote, describe a moment when your connection to the Eucharist got you through a painful time or when the Eucharist finally made some sense to you, tell us what you wish your grandchild or other Catholics could feel about the Eucharist. Your approach is as personal as your connection to the Eucharist. There are sign-up lists and instructions in the Gathering Space. Remember to record your reflection in landscape mode.


