# THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION





"That the dead will rise..."



Have you ever wondered what we will look like after the resurrection? This came up in conversation recently while looking through a family photo album. Will we be young, old, prime of life? Will there be bad hair days in the hereafter? Horn-rimmed glasses? For that matter, have you ever wondered what we will do for all eternity?

Jesus gives us an answer to these questions when he answers the Sadducees in today's Gospel. They tried to trick him with the question of the seven brothers who all in turn legally married the same woman. Whose wife would she be at the resurrection, they asked? Jesus tells them that the coming age will be different. Those "deemed worthy...can no longer die, for they are like angels."

In other words our human concepts of young, old, prime of life won't matter. Nor will our feeble understanding of time. At the resurrection those "deemed worthy" will exist beyond our human limits of understanding.

In restating the Old Testament promise of resurrection Jesus tells us not to worry about the limitations of this life as we aspire to eternal life.





# **Eucharistic Revival at Our Lady of Mercy**

#### What Does The Eucharist Mean To Me?

What Does The Eucharist Mean to You? Many Catholics were shocked when a national survey revealed that most Catholics have a limited understanding of the Eucharist and a tenuous connection to this central Mystery of our faith. As the Bishops of the U.S. launch a two year Eucharistic Revival, OLM is taking a moment to reflect on what the Eucharist means to each of us. The most significant way to influence others is by sincerely sharing from the heart. Therefore, each of us is invited to make a short 2 to 3 minute video witnessing to what the Eucharist means to each one of us personally. These videos will be posted on the parish Facebook and webpage in October and November. If anyone needs help making the

recording, just visit the parish office and Katie will record you on her phone. Willing to write but not willing to speak on camera? Submit your reflection in writing and a volunteer will record it for you. Feel free to find a format that feels comfortable to you. Interview your child or grandparent about the meaning of the Eucharist in their life, share a meaningful quote, describe a moment when your connection to the Eucharist got you through a painful time or when the Eucharist finally made some sense to you, tell us what you wish your grandchild or other Catholics could feel about the Eucharist. Your approach is as personal as your connection to the Eucharist. There are sign-up lists and instructions in the Gathering Space. Remember to record your reflection in landscape mode.

# Synod Process: Where It's Been and Where It's Going.

Synod come from ancient Greek. It can be translated as "journeying together." While synods have been held since ancient times, the work synodality is very new. It means that the entire People of God assembling together, journeying together, and actively participating in the evangelizing mission of the Church. Last year Pope Francis invited all the faithful to join together to consider how we are journeying together in our pilgrimage of faith. At Our Lady of Mercy all were invited to participate and over fifty parishioners accepted the invitation. At listening sessions of approximately ten people per session the following questions were considered. What are the ways in which Our Lady of Mercy and the Erie Diocese most successfully bring people together in their faith journey? What steps does the Spirit invite us to take in order to grow as a faith community living the Gospel message? All are invited to come to a comparison of the reports highlighting what common themes run throughout the reports.
