

THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION

LUKE 21:5-19

"By your perseverance you will secure your lives."



Wars, earthquakes, famines and plagues have been a reality in every historical age. And yet, whenever they occur, people begin to predict and worry about "the end time."

This gospel makes it clear that Jesus does not want us to dwell in fear on "signs" of the final times. Instead he deflects attention to "now." How well are we persevering until the time that God's Kingdom is completely fulfilled? The truth is that signs of the Kingdom already are visible.

The people I admire most are those who recognize and talk about those signs. (Jesus has given them "wisdom in speaking.") The people I mean are those who see and talk about the best in others, who see and talk about the beauty in nature, who expect positive outcomes, who laugh and find joy in all kinds of things.

These people persevere every day in looking for the signs of the Kingdom, sharing them, dwelling on them. In this, Jesus says, they are securing their lives. I rely on their example. Because of them, I am more able to persevere, to shake off my fears and to believe in the promise of security that we hear in today's gospel.

For Reflection: Do I recognize the signs of God's Kingdom in my daily routine? Do these signs fill me with fear or with hope?

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments

Know the Warning Signs of a Predator Perpetrators are not waiting on the street to snatch kids; only 10% of sexually abused children are abused by strangers. 90% are abused by someone known and trusted by the child/child's family. Perpetrators integrate themselves into everyone's life, not just the child. They build relationships so that they are trusted to be alone with the child. One of the most important ways to ensure the safety of children in our environments is to know the warning signs of adults who present a risk of harm to children. Among these signs are when the person (1) always wants to be alone with a child in areas where no one can monitor the interactions, (2) allows a child to do things their parents would not permit, (3) is always more excited to be with children than with adults, and (4) discourages others from participating in activities involving kids. 
