

LUKE 23:35-43

Healing Service


Mark your calendars the Healing Service will be held on December 5, 2022 at 7:00. In what areas of your



On Kneeling at Mass

Beginning on the 2nd Sunday of Advent, we as an assembly, are asked to kneel during the *Eucharistic Prayer* and then again later, during the Lamb of God. Of course this request is accompanied by the time-worn phrase, as you are able. Those who are unable to kneel may sit during these times.

There are several reasons we are asked to make this change now. First, we are past the most dangerous part of the pandemic and it is relatively safe to return to normal and to regular practices. At the height of the Covid experience, Fr. Ritchie asked us not to kneel to eliminate the need to sanitize the kneelers after every Mass. Second, about a year ago, in the fall of 2021, Bishop Persico asked all parishes to kneel during the Lamb of God so that we may be in communion with the rest of the dioceses that make up the province of the archdiocese of Philadelphia, that is, all the dioceses of Pennsylvania. Again, because of the pandemic, Fr. Ritchie, asked us not to kneel.

Some may say that this is a step backward, toward past practices. And in one sense, they would be correct. These were the standard postures for Mass before the Second Vatican Council and the introduction of the document on the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, However, it is more complicated than that. As the new order for liturgy was prepared for introduction following Vatican II, the Bishops of the United States petitioned Rome to "stay kneeling" during the Eucharistic Prayer so as to avoid a disruption in the celebration of the Mass. Their reasoning, they said, was that the American people are a penitential people and kneeling is the posture of penance. So, an exception was made for the U.S. in the liturgical documents. Since that time, many who study liturgy and liturgical practices around the world began to teach about the ancient practice of standing during the Eucharistic Prayer. They cited the understanding of the early church that standing during prayer is respectful and engages the individual in the praver.

As a result, a combination of postures existed, depending on the pastor, through the end of the 20th century. In 2000, Pope John Paul II announced that the Missal would be updated for the new millennium. That update took ten years, plus the time to translate the new

texts for English speakers. In the meantime, the instruction for the Missal was prepared for publication. Again the U.S. bishops' requested to maintain kneeling during the Eucharistic Prayer and that request was granted. So, today, the universal posture is standing through the Eucharistic Prayer while the posture in the U.S. remains kneeling.

Kneeling during the Lamb of God has a different history. When the Vatican II liturgy was introduced, the instruction recognized that in the U.S. some bishops might wish to stand for the Communion Rite, which extends from the Lord's Prayer through the Prayer After Communion. This, they felt, would help create a united movement of parishioners in the communion procession, living out exactly the unity prayed for in the Eucharistic Prayer. Therefore, each bishop was allowed to choose the posture for the Lamb of God in their diocese. At the time, Bishop Trautman opted for standing during this prayer. Unfortunately, some arguments broke out across diocesan borders with parishioners on one side claiming that "you don't celebrate the Mass properly!" (Read that to mean "you don't celebrate the way we do.") And this brings us to Bishop Persico's decision to kneel during the Lamb of God for the sake of communion with the rest of the diocese and the other dioceses of Pennsylvania.

As we continue to talk about kneeling, I would like to introduce you to "Aunt Mabel." Aunt Mabel insists on bringing the stuffing to our Thanksgiving dinner. By most accounts it is dry and unappealing. (Some do love it covered in gravy.) But we all love her, so we eat a bit of it, smile, and thank her for being there and bringing her stuffing. The heart of our faith is built on relationships. The very nature of God, Father, Son and Spirit, is, by definition, relational. Perhaps, Aunt Mabel's example could help us look beyond our preferences, wishes and certainties and focus first on our relationships. From Mabel, might we learn to extend this relational wisdom to our communal

practices at Mass?
