THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION



MATTHEW 11:2-11

"When John the Baptist heard in prison..."

The tenacity of John the Baptist is amazing. He went to the desert to seek the Lord. He fasted on the merest of foods found in nature. He plunged those who would listen into the waters of the Jordan, hoping to prepare Israel for the Messiah. He preached fearlessly.

It was his preaching that got him thrown into prison. Prison. Not a pleasant place to be, even in our own time, much less his. Yet even from the deprivation of his imprisonment, he kept searching for the Messiah, asking, "Are you the one?"

Prison can be real for many of us, whether we find ourselves in an actual cell or not. Some of us feel trapped by depression, physical disability, a serious illness or chronic pain, a troubled marriage, or a disappointing job.

Oh, that we could have the same fire of John the Baptist! Let us take strength from John and never allow anything, even prison, to keep us from seeking the Lord. Let us burn with the desire to find the Messiah, no matter what! Let us rejoice in the fact that the one we seek indeed has come.

For Reflection: In what surprising places have I recognized the Lord's presence? How does God equip me to follow my desires to seek the Lord?

Daytime Grief Support Group




