



THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION

MATTHEW 1:18-24

When Joseph awoke, he did as the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took his





He could just as easily have said "no." His rights had been violated and his ego damaged. He could have saved his own pride by humiliating Mary before the whole town.

Joseph stands in contrast to our culture's obsession with protecting our rights (or is it our pride?). Society tells us that if we don't stand up for our rights, people will make victims of us. We cant let ourselves become doormats, after all. But Joseph's example challenges us to take that risk.

"God's ways are not our ways," says Isaiah (55:8). Joseph knew that Scripture better than we do. A true servant of the Lord like Mary, he said "yes," and accepted Mary into his home and heart.

As Christmas approaches, I am very grateful for those people in my life who have accepted me into their hearts. I'm grateful to people who respond with kindness to me when I have been intolerant of them. I'm especially grateful to people who have given me a second chance when I have clearly wronged them.

For Reflection: In what ways is God asking me to take a risk? Who could benefit from this risk and how?

Daytime Grief Support Group






