

THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION

LUKE 2:15-20

Joseph went up from Galilee from the town of Nazareth to Judea, to the city of David that is called Bethlehem, because he



was of the house and family of David, to be enrolled with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child.

It is hard to imagine there was once a time when one man could order a census of the "whole world." No doubt there was grumbling and resistance, and not a few folds who hid from the census obligation, but many obeyed - including Joseph and Mary.

Can you imagine what it was like, leaving home to return to your ancestral town, packing food for the long journey, providing for family and animals left behind, shuttering the doors of your business, seeing to the many needs of your traveling family...just for a census?

Can you imagine making a trip if you were pregnant, or your wife was pregnant? What anxieties would have flooded your mind? Physical discomforts? Resentments? Who does Caesar Augustus think he is, issuing such a ridiculous, high-handed decree?

It is sobering to ponder how Mary and Joseph made their rough journey in wonder and worry, how no one had room for them, how their Jesus was born in a stable among the animals, and how they finally drifted off to fitful sleep on beds of hay, their Son and Savior between them.

It is wondrous to ponder that they endured all this for us.

For Reflection: What images enter my mind as I contemplate the birth of Jesus? How do these images help to shape my appreciation for the gift of the Incarnation?
