

I Don't Want to be Martha Anymore Luke 10:38-42 By Lois Heise

Raise your hand if you're a Martha. My mother used to say "Lois, will you please sit down." I rarely did then and I don't now as there's always something needing done. Sure, everyone has relationships, careers and daily responsibilities. But, I'm tired of always being busy.

I've always made sure the house was clean, the family was fed, emails were answered, and bills were paid. I also volunteered. I will always be a Martha to some extent and I am proud of that. She was after all a strong, disciplined and very faithful disciple of our Lord. God used this ordinary woman to demonstrate a strong faith declaring her belief that Jesus was the Messiah (John 11:25-27). I too, am a homemaker and caretaker by nature. But, sometimes I forget to take care of myself and my faith.

Mary's freedom of life is a good example. She threw caution to the wind and spent expensive perfume and didn't help with chores in order to spend her time showing love and gratitude to Jesus. My expensive perfume is my time. I may not be able to literally sit at Jesus' feet, but I can spend my time with him praying and reading the Bible or devotionals. I can enjoy being outside, not busy gardening or working like Martha would. But, more like Mary who would probably just sit and be still to soak in his sunlight and the beauty he made. I could use the time to meditate on my prayers and daily readings. Resting quietly means I might hear his voice like Mary did.

Could it be I need rest from the world's busyness? I could stop every day to rest in his arms or sit at his feet by being quiet and still. I could use his strength, wisdom and love to help me through my days. Maybe then I truly can be the disciple he wants me to be. Maybe I



can create a sense of balance between both Martha and Mary.

God's the one who strengthens me to endure my chores and helps me when life gets tough. I share my joys and gratitude in life with him as well. Like any friend I have, I must make the effort to grow our relationship.

This will take practice. I can start by not people pleasing and having self-pity for all I do. I can stop feeling my tasks are too important to relax. I'm not lazy if I'm not busy. I forget God wants me close to him. He wants me to seek his guidance. He wants me to be happy and enjoy the daily blessings he gives me. I can't express my gratitude to God if I'm busy crossing off items on my 'to do' list. That busyness sometimes puts him at the end of my list instead of first. So, I'm going to practice being free like Mary and spend my time where it really counts, pleasing God. I look forward to resting in his presence.
