JN 9:1-41

God asks a rhetorical and slightly sarcastic question to Samuel, the prophet: "How long will you grieve for Saul, whom I have rejected as king of Israel?" Like us, Samuel is depressed that the old king failed. It's painful to admit that the old regime is done. But God won't let us wallow in our pity-party forever. "I am sending you to Jesse of Bethlehem," announces the Lord, "for I have chosen my king from among his sons." Samuel finally goes and anoints the young David as the new king. And his kingdom is glorious; it's the golden age of Israel's earthly history.

How discouraging to see that my own selfish ego is no longer in charge! How long will I grieve that money, power, pleasure, and reputation have been rejected as the ruler of my life? How wonderful that God has a new future in store for you and me. He is sending us to Bethlehem to anoint the new David as our king. His kingdom won't fail us. He'll slay our goliaths, unite our dispersed energies, and build a Temple where God himself will dwell.

Pastoral Council FAQ's

WHAT

The primary purpose of the Pastoral Council is the spiritual growth of the parish community. The Pastoral Council engages in the process of pastoral planning and helps to set the direction of the parish community in prayer, leadership, service and pastoral action in consultation with the Pastor and Staff.



Wно

A person of prayer, committed to our faith community and willing to share thoughts, ideas and observations in order to build a vibrant parish family. The Council fosters a climate of teamwork and operates using a consensus model.


Who is eligible to become a council member?

- Has been baptized or received into the Roman Catholic Church.
- By his/her free and consistent choice is a registered member of Our Lady of Mercy Parish.
- Contributes to the betterment of the parish community.



What do I need to know?

If you bring with you a desire to learn, everything you need to know in order to create a vision and goals is provided. The council studies together any important documents or areas of church life as needed to form policy. There is an orientation session for new members.



AM I RIGHT FOR THE JOB?

All nominees are led through a discernment process to determine if they are being called to serve on the council at this time. There is an informational meeting at which Nominees are invited into a period of discernment.



COMMITMENT

As representatives of the people of the parish – you are the eyes and ears of the parish. Members are encouraged to speak with a variety of parishioners about issues to gain a sense of where the parish community is. Pastoral Council Homework – read material necessary to be informed to enable good decision making for the parish. You will receive minutes from other committees and groups on a regular basis to keep informed about what other groups are doing. The Council may study a church document in order to make a good pastoral decision regarding an issue for goal planning. Time commitment: approximately 2-4 hours per month including the council meeting.



WHEN

The First Tuesday of Each Month:

- o 15 minutes in prayer.
- o 30 minutes in study & Discussion.
- o 30-40 minutes for other business.
- o 10 minutes to review upcoming events. Meetings last about 90 minutes



How

Decision making by Consensus – Means all members of the council need to voice their views and opinions. Everyone has to speak. No dumb ideas. Every thing adds to the discussion. Decisions are made with prayerful discernment, a merging of insights and consensus. These decisions have to do with long term planning and the spiritual direction of the parish. Most decisions are made as part of a process rather than a hard vote. This process usually takes a number of meetings.
