

# THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION

# THE 4<sup>TH</sup> SUNDAY OF EASTER



I recently rescued a dog. She's a terrier and rather adorable. And she's crazy about me. She could spend all day with me. But I'm a pastor at a parish and sometimes I leave her at the front desk of the church office. She constantly amazes me by her ability to distinguish between my voice and that of everyone else. If I say one word, even if I'm hidden around a corner, she'll sprint toward me and jump up into my arms.

This week the readings focus our attention to the voice of the risen Jesus Christ. Comparing his disciples to sheep and himself to a shepherd, he says, "They recognize his voice." He speaks to us and wants us to respond. When we hear his voice, we follow. Throughout this coming week, we will experience many interior promptings to receive God's love, and to love Him in return. That's his voice. Follow it into the safe and tender arms of Christ.

By contrast, some voices we will hear do not convey God's concern and love for us, but rather produce fear, despair, and other harmful mischief. Jesus calls these voices those of robbers. Does an idea or thought make it harder for you to love God? If so, run away. Let it go. It is most likely not the voice of the Risen Lord. Keep waiting for him to speak. You will recognize his voice. Then run to him as fast as you can.

#### Knights of Columbus- 2023 Baby Bottle Fundraiser

Our Knights Council has joined together with 23 other Knights Councils in Erie and Crawford Counties to conduct our annual Baby Bottle Fundraiser. It will benefit the Women's Care Center of Erie's goal of purchasing a new, state of the art Ultrasound Machine to replace and older unit at one of their other locations. Your donations will also be used to offset the operating costs of the ultrasound van that was purchased from the 2022 fundraiser. Last year through your contributions, \$119,000 was collected toward the cost of the ultrasound van. The Knights of Columbus Supreme based in Connecticut donated an additional \$59.000 to cover the entire cost of the ultrasound machine for the van. We will be distributing baby bottles and optional donation envelopes as you leave church Mother's Day weekend, May 13-14. Bottles and envelopes will still be available in the Gathering Space following that weekend. We ask that you fill the bottles with your coins, cash, or checks and return them Father's Day weekend, June 17-18. Paper currency or checks may be put in the envelopes that can be placed in the collection baskets or dropped off at the Parish office. Please make all checks payable to the Knights of Columbus. Thank you for your time and we pray that you will join us in our continuing efforts in saving the lives of the unborn.

CSA Report 2023

We take this opportunity to Thank Tom Eckendorf who has been involved in the Bereavement Ministry since 2012. For the last number of years Tom was our bereavement ministry coordinator. He stepped down in February.

#### From Tom Eckendorf:

I was asked to share about the Bereavement Ministry of which I was the coordinator for many years. A lot of people have a misconception about this ministry and most shy away from it, I think, because of the finality of a funeral.

Consider the family of the deceased. They have a lot on their minds because of the loss of their loved one. They are grief stricken! Calling family, meeting with a funeral home and arranging a funeral mass.

This is what our ministry does to make this part of their process easier. We have a funeral booklet. The family can take this home with them and it helps the family figure out how they can participate in the funeral mass. It contains readings and music selections to choose from and there is a page to put the names of the family members who will participate in the mass. Yes, we fully encourage the family to participate by placing the cross, Pall, bring up the gifts of bread and wine and read the scripture.

And that's where our ministry helps; some families don't have family members to do

these important things. We arrange Eucharistic Ministers for the distribution of the Eucharist. We have Lectors available when family member are too distraught to read at the last minute. Our Lector stands in to take their place. Most times the Lector never reads but just available in case someone backs out.

It doesn't take a lot of time. It's like showing up for a regular mass. There is a calling tree list we go through. You may get a call to see if you are available for a mass, say, Wednesday. If you're busy, we call the next person. There aren't a lot of funerals either. You may only get a call once or twice! And if you can't make it, and that's fine too. It's pretty easy and the families truly appreciate how smoothly the mass goes, more than you know!

Five parishioners recently joined the Bereavement ministry. We need Eucharistic Ministers, Lectors and Altar Servers and greeters. Our ministry helps by showing support for our parish family in their greatest time of need and the families truly appreciate it.
