

### THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION 27 Words That Matter



One of the quickest things you learn as a parent is how dangerous it is to explain too much, especially when your kid is teetering on the brink of a rebellion. The fewer words you use, the more power they have. A kid who is about to be carried away by their feelings needs to be brought back to earth with a tether made of short, succinct directions.

There are a lot of similarities between the Pharisees of Scripture and a toddler on the edge of a meltdown. Stay with me — this will make sense, I promise. Think about it: both toddlers and Pharisees have lots of feelings and lots of opinions. Both toddlers and Pharisees think you're out to get them. Both toddlers and Pharisees keep trying to trick you to get what they think they want.

A thorough Google search informs me that there are about 80,000 words in the Torah. Eighty-thousand words, and Jesus can boil it all down to 27: "You shall love the Lord, your God,

with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind" and "You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

It doesn't make the excess words untrue; it doesn't even make them unnecessary. Sometimes I need the long explanation, the full and complete picture.

Because sometimes, as much as I hate to admit it, I act like both a toddler and a Pharisee. I am carried away by my feelings. I don't trust God. I am about to bolt.

When that happens, I need to be told in short and simple terms what my salvation means. I need a tether made of short, succinct directions.

The Harborcreek Ministerium presents Lunch with the Lord Tuesday, Nov. 14 12-1:00 p.m. Faith Lutheran Church 5414 E. Lake Rd. Speaker: Brian Gray



All are invited to this monthly ecumenical event for fellowship and sharing our faith journeys. Bring a bag lunch. The host church will provide beverages and a simple dessert.

This month's speaker will be Brian Gray, Director of Music at Faith Lutheran, who will share some of his faith story; music may be involved. Below is a summary of the annual report which includes the income and expenses for the daily operation of the church and the longer-term capital expenses for building & grounds maintenance.

The 2023 annual report, included separately in this bulletin, shows an offertory income of \$427,000 (numbers rounded) and expenses for operating the parish of \$481,000. The operating loss of \$54,000 was offset by the Parish Festival profits of \$21,000 giving only a net loss of \$33,000 for the year. This also demonstrates how important the Parish Festival is to the overall health of the church.

Our Capital Income of \$125,000 did cover the major repairs for this year Our capital expenses totaled \$113,000. (See the report for details.)

Considering everything going on with pastoral planning with the diocese, we thought it would be timely to also share the trends we have been seeing over the past five years. The first chart is our Profit & Loss Statement and the second is an Offertory Recap.

From the P&L Statement we see the offertory numbers have been relativity flat. Unfortunately, during the same period, largely due to a substantial rise in inflation, our expenses continued to rise. In Total Over 5 years, we show a \$55K loss. We had to dip into our savings account for capital repairs to cover this loss. We need to find a way to reverse this trend. Rest assured, as a finance council, we are very watchful of our expenses. We are always reviewing costs, looking for savings.

The second chart shows the giving profile of the parish. These figures are also alarming: our parish membership is down by about 9%. While this is a concern, it is also a real complement to our parish family since our offertory has remained relatively flat. However, the number of families who have been unable to donate has grown dramatically. We certainly understand that some of our families are simply unable to donate based on things they have going on in their lives.

We would ask all of you to take some time and consider the value Our Lady of Mercy brings to you and your families. Is there anything further you can do to help insure the financial future of our Parish?



If there are reasons that weekly or monthly giving simply won't work for you, perhaps you could consider donating to Our Lady of Mercy through the #iGiveCatholic campaign which is on November 27, 2023 (Giving Tuesday). Unlike the

annual CSA appeal, all money donated to Our Lady of Mercy through the #IGiveCatholic stays right here in our Parish. You will see more information on this topic as the date gets closer.
