

Where there is no vision, the people perish

(Proverbs 29:18)

Back in the summer of 2021, the staff began asking where we were going, what was our purpose? The need for a vision began to surface. During the Feast Day homily quoting from Proverbs that without vision the people perish, Fr. Ritchie talked about where we had been as a parish (our past), who we were (our present) and asked where we were going (our future). He wanted to see the parish grow and become revitalized. The Pastoral Council affirmed the need to revitalize and supported hiring a parish coach to lead us through a visioning process. With a grant from the Catholic Foundation and using some of our John and Barbara Jacquel endowment monies, we hired a parish coach in January of 2022.

Seeking the Holy Spirit's guidance, the Prayer to the Holy Spirit was composed by Council in February 2022. Starting that March, the Vision Team began work on creating our vision statement. Finally, in February 2023, the draft was complete. We then shared the vision with parish leaders and found them to be very supportive.

Wanting to make the vision visible and tangible, we created our Vision Logo that we plan to use in many ways. This logo was printed on tee-shirts that many wore to our 2023 Feast Day when we officially "launched' our vision and the beginning of our journey along this discipleship pathway. "Encounter Christ, Grow in His Love, Serve in His Name" – We extend a special

Serve in His Name" – We extend a special thank you to three of our members who spoke on each of these aspects of our vision at this year's Feast Day. Steve Brainard recognized that his encounter with Christ grew from examples of several individuals over many years. Andriana Grosch drew analogies with nature and our growth in Christ, encouraging continual renewal and transformation based in His love through all seasons of our lives. Vickie Gilchrest highlighted the many ways of serving by sharing ways she has served in His name, how they have changed over time and the value of the encouragement she received to serve

So, two years after Fr. Ritchie talked of needing a vision, Fr. Matt launched us on our path of discipleship. 'A path that is for all of us, for each of us to embrace and to live each moment of every day and when we fall short to begin the journey again.'

Vision Leadership Summit Key Takeaways

- ♦ There was good support of the vision statement: The 10-word vision is spot on; the explanations made it more concrete, and the words being used are very active, deliberate words.
- Personal invitation is key. The way to get new people to participate is through personal invitation from parishioners, Father, staff.
- We need to be a multigenerational community reaching youth and young families.
- We need to continue our welcoming spirit, to continue to build a welcoming environment.
- ♦ We need to be open to new opportunities see new needs.
- There was general excitement around the possibility of change so we can grow. Feel the need to build new, quality experiences.





The parishioners of Our Lady of Mercy have done a remarkable job with managing resources over many years, thanks to our outstanding finance council.

This past year our offertory income was \$427,000 (numbers rounded) and expenses for operating the parish were \$481,000 for operating loss of \$54,000. Parish Festival profits of \$21,000 offset that loss giving us a net loss of \$33,000 for the year. This also demonstrates how important the Parish Festival is to the overall health of the church.

Our capital income of \$125,000 included \$83,000 from CSA contributions, donations from the Knights of Columbus of \$5000, Donations from parishioners of \$1000, and investment income of \$35,000. Our capital expenses totaled \$113,000. This included \$70,000 in CSA payments to the diocese and \$43,000 in various capital expenditures to the buildings and grounds: repairs to the parking lot, concrete walkways, gas line, and portions of the roof.

In light of everything going on with pastoral planning with the diocese, we thought it would be timely to go beyond just the financials of this year and share with you the trends we have been seeing over the past five years. We have included two small spreadsheets showing 5-year trends. The first is our Profit & Loss Statement and the second is an Offertory Recap.

From the P&L Statement we see the offertory numbers have been relativity flat. Unfortunately, during the same period, our expenses continued to rise, due to inflation and also the effects of Covid-19 which changed our lives dramatically. Over 5 years we show a \$55K loss. And although we had to dip into our savings to cover this loss, be assured, that the finance council is very watchful of our expenses. The entire staff is very aware of spending and looking to cut costs.

These figures in the second chart are also concerning: our parish membership is down by about 9%. However, it is also a real complement to our parish family since our offertory has remained relatively flat. However, the number of families who have been unable to donate has grown dramatically. We certainly understand that some of our families are simply unable to donate based on things they have going on in their lives.




We would ask all of you to take some time and consider the value Our Lady of Mercy brings to you and your families.

Jesus and the Eucharist Study

Dear Parishioners,

As we continue the year of parish Eucharistic Revival, we invite you to grow closer to Jesus alongside fellow parishioners from Saint Mark, Mount Calvary, Saint James and Our Lady of Mercy via the Jesus and the Eucharist study. Each session is full of rich theological content, powerful testimonies, and timely messages from individual bishops across the country. This is a great opportunity to dive more deeply into the richness of our Eucharistic faith.

BELOW IS AN OVERVIEW OF EACH SESSION:

Session 1: What's Our Story?

The Bible is the story of God's love for us. He created us out of love, redeemed us by his love, and transforms us in his love

Session 2: Who Is Jesus?

Jesus is both God and man, therefore he reveals who God is in relation to us. Jesus asked Simon Peter, "Who do you say that I am?" (Matthew 16:15) He asks this same question of us: who do you say Jesus is?

Session 3: Am I Saved?

Salvation is a gift from God through Jesus Christ that requires our "yes."

Session 4: Why a Church?

Jesus didn't simply leave us a written message or instruction manual to follow. He gave us a living, dynamic Church where we encounter him personally and allow ourselves to be transformed into his likeness.

Session 5: God Is With Us

God's presence in the Old Testament foreshadows the gift of the Eucharist, one of the seven sacraments of the Church. Jesus established the Eucharist to give us strength and accompany us at every moment of our earthly journey.

Session 6: The Story of the Eucharist

The story of the Eucharist can be traced throughout Scripture. From Genesis to the present day, this session explores how the Cross is the new Tree of Life, and the Eucharist is its fruit.

Session 7: Bread for the Journey

The Eucharist sustains us on our spiritual journey. Our participation at Mass through the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist is an offering of thanksgiving to God. We are then sent forth to share what we have received.

PRO-LIFE

It has been another great year for *The Baby-Bottle Campaign* with proceeds exceeding \$75,000 and going toward the operation and maintenance of the new van and equipment purchased last year. This year, Crawford County donations will stay at the pregnancy center in Meadville. There is also talk of hiring new employees. Several lives have been saved as women chose life rather than abortion. Thank you to all who supported this fundraiser.

PARISH DANCE FEATURING THE GROOVE

This annual dance, which in the past has been an overwhelming hit with the parish and community alike, is scheduled for Friday, November 10th, which is later this year than in the past, but still in conjunction with the Parish Feast Day. *By the time you receive this newsletter, it may have already occurred.* It is sponsored by the Knights Council of OLM and as usual a good turnout is expected. Thanks to The Groove who reportedly loves entertaining at our parish, to those who plan to attend or have already attended and to those who work so hard to make sure it is enjoyed by all.

TIME TO BE GENEROUS

In the future - As the cool weather approaches, we will begin to hear of coat drives and of the needs of our brothers and sisters during the upcoming winter season and the holidays. All are called to be generous with our giving. The Knights will donate to the Harborcreek Food Pantry and an anonymous OLM family at Christmas time - plus other worthy causes as the need arises.

In the past – the natural and man-made disasters just keep on occurring – and we have responded, since that is one of the needs Knights are called to address. One worth mentioning is the fires in Hawaii. We donated in the name of Father Ritchie, especially since he was the Chaplain for the Erie Fire Department.

The first of two annual \$500 donations was made for the *Support of Seminarians*.

A \$100 donation was made to each of the three local fire departments.
