

BEREAVEMENT Ministry

MINISTRY DESCRIPTION/OVERVIEW:

The Bereavement ministry's mission is to provide comfort and support to the grieving family members. We try to make the funeral process as easy as possible, all the while remembering that every funeral is exactly the same by design, yet totally different in the way each individual experiences it and remembers it.

ACTIVITIES OF MINISTRY:

- To serve the family, making the funeral process less stressful
- Plan a memorial Mass for parishioners who have lost a loved one
- Send sympathy cards to the family several months after the funeral to assure them their loved one is still being remembered in prayer
- Visit the funeral home
- Act as Greeters, Lectors, Altar Servers, and Eucharistic Ministers for each funeral Mass.

• Rotating schedule, commitment times vary

EXPECTATIONS OF MINISTRY:

- Act as Ushers, Lectors, and Eucharistic
 Ministers for the funeral Mass
- Answer any questions for family and friends during the Mass and create an atmosphere of hospitality
- Provide the extra worship aids for the family to mail to other friends and family who could not attend the funeral Mass
